The consolidation serves as a moment to review current setup of banks with multi country operations. Today certain local special accounts need to be used. e.g. for settlement of checks or tax payments. Besides the Eurosystem harmonisation in terms of monetary use of the CSM/MCA e.g. reserve management. Shall other NCB specific operations be treated in a TARGET general way. i.e. can be settled from a cross border MCA or RTGS? Shall local domestic systems exist next to TARGET2?	All central banks have confirmed that no legal obligations exist for enforcing the use of domestic T2-RTGS accounts
Which ISO 20022 version will be used? Other market infrastructures appear to use the 2019 version. Banks are preparing for ISO20022 in various systems around the world.	The Target services will use ISO 20022 with the 2019 version until 2023 – Therefore with a two year freeze period

Today, in T2S, I hold a dedicated cash account. Since T2 consolidates to T2S, what is the impact?

T2S is one of the TARGET Services. T2S shall also make use of the common components. The T2S NSP contracts will end in 2022 and converge with the new Target Services NSP contracts. A number of change requests is being processed towards the consolidation. T2S CR-0721 links to other T2S change requests. e.g. the optional maintenance period or the possibility to leave overnight balance on the T2S DCA or take it into account for reserve management requirements

Readiness reporting is required by each central bank that shall open cash accounts in CLM and or RTGS. How should branches or subsidiaries of non-domestic banks report to DNB?

Readiness reporting is organised by the Eurosystem using harmonised readiness reports. Branches or subsidiaries may present the report from their parent company for reporting purposes to DNB providing that this report states that it also covers the readiness of the branch or subsidiary in question

Readiness reporting is required by each central bank to open cash accounts in CLM and or RTGS. How should banks who report also for branches or subsidiaries of non-domestic banks report to DNB?

Each central bank collects readiness reporting for its respective T2 segment. DNB would like to know the readiness of banks with future accounts in CLM and or RTGS in T2-NL. If the readiness report includes other branches or subsidiaries than the overall readiness status to DNB (green, yellow, red) needs to cover only the T2-NL readiness
